



# Lower Travel Costs!

## Options are available.

The Mayor's proposed tax on ride share companies will protect public schools and ensure students have the resources they deserve.

If ride share companies choose to pass these costs directly onto riders, there are options for individuals with disabilities to help lower their travel costs.

**There are options for individuals with disabilities, and to those aged 65 years and older, to help lower their travel costs:**

### **SEPTA Reduced Fare Program**

- Individuals with disabilities are eligible for a Reduced Fare Card, including half-fare discount on SEPTA services and 2 free transfers within 2 hours of first tap
- To apply, complete the application and mail/bring it to:

  - SEPTA Suburban Station, 16th St. & JFK Blvd., Philadelphia, PA 19102



### **SEPTA Access (formerly CCT Connect)**

- Individuals with disabilities that are unable to use regular public transportation are eligible for SEPTA Access, a complementary ride share service that can be scheduled 1-3 days in advance, with each trip within the service region costing \$5.75.
- Complete the SEPTA Access application and mail/bring it to:
